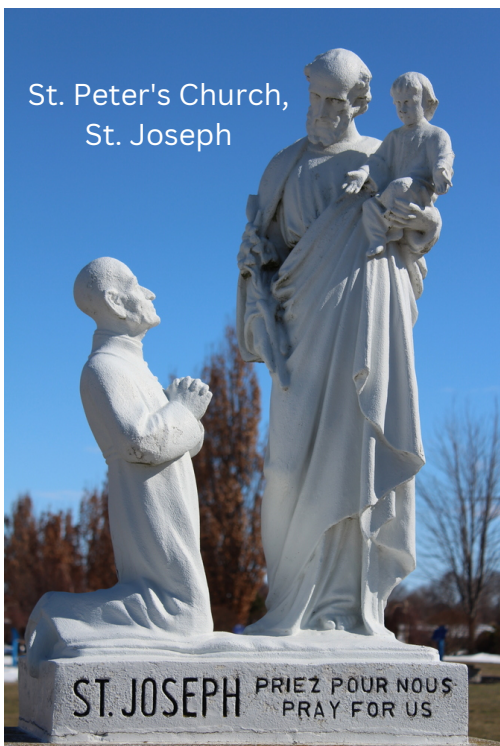
In 1896, the town of St. Joseph was established. Narcisse Cantin had a great devotion to St. Joseph and named the town after him. Later, he met Brother André who also had a great devotion to St. Joseph and the two became friends. Brother André visited St. Joseph and marked a spot in the town where he hoped a statue of St. Joseph could be erected. It took over 50 years but in 1972 a beautiful statue of St. Joseph was erected in the park thanks to the efforts of Tony LaPorte and Napoleon Cantin.
